Dear Chairman Graves,

On behalf of the National Association of County Park and Recreation Officials (NACPRO), I respectfully urge Congress to continue its strong support for the Transportation Alternatives (TA) Program, the Recreational Trails Program (RTP), and the Active Transportation Infrastructure Investment Program (ATIIP). Sustaining funding for these initiatives is essential to meeting national transportation, public health, and safety goals.

While these programs represent a small fraction of overall federal transportation spending, their impact is significant. They improve bicycle and pedestrian safety, provide ADA-compliant non-motorized transportation networks, expand access to active and healthy modes of transportation, and enhance quality of life in both urban and rural communities across the country. Federal investments have helped counties build safer at-grade crossings, expand off-road trail networks, and connect neighborhoods to schools, workplaces, parks, and other vital destinations.

These programs do more than build infrastructure—they empower communities. Trails and bikeways reduce road congestion, increase mobility options, and promote healthier lifestyles. They also support economic development through tourism and revitalization, especially in underserved or rural areas.

There are over 1,800 county and county-level park and recreation agencies. Many members of Congress began their careers in county government, where they saw firsthand how local leaders—when supported by federal partnerships—can deliver results quickly and effectively. These local agencies operate efficiently and are deeply rooted in the needs of their communities, making them ideal partners for federal investment.

Continued and expanded funding for TA, RTP, and ATIIP will ensure that we can build on this success and bring the benefits of safe, accessible active transportation to all Americans. Together, federal and local governments can help create a more connected, healthier, and resilient nation.
